IEP vs. non-IEP Medicaid enrollment

Step 1: School Enrolls with North Dakota Medicaid as a
Provider Type – 025 Agencies and
Provider Specialty – 397 Local Education
Agency(LEA)/Special Education

Step 2: If school provides **both** IEP & non-IEP services, it
will need two separate National Provider Identifiers
AND two separate enrollment records for billing and
reimbursement

Schools are responsible for billing IEP or non-IEP services under
appropriate records and NPI.

Step 1: School Enrolls with North Dakota Medicaid as a 025/397 Agency/Local Education Agency(LEA)/Special Education

Step 2: School obtains NPI(s) and completes separate enrollments for IEP & non-IEP services (if providing both)

Taxonomy Codes

Taxonomy codes identify a health care provider by the service they provide and area of specialty.

Providers are required to submit taxonomy codes when **submitting paper** or **electronic claims** to ND Medicaid. This excludes Qualified Service Providers (HCBS claims), transportation claims, and claims submitted by other atypical provider types.

Taxonomy codes are:

- Maintained on the provider's record and will be verified based on licenses and certifications
- Submitted to North Dakota on claims and other items such as service authorizations
- Used during adjudication
- Required on paper and electronic claims. Claims without the required taxonomy code will be denied.

Taxonomy codes listed on a claim MUST match the taxonomy codes on a provider's record or the claims will be denied.

Student Eligibility Verification

Click on the Member field next to Home

- Check eligibility
- Populate 2 of the 3 fields: Member ID, Date of Birth, Last Name, First Name
- Fill in Service from Date and Service to Date
- Service Type must equal 30-Health Benefit
- Click Search

Student Eligibility Verification, cont'd

You will see what plans the member is enrolled in.

- Health Tracks/Early Periodic Screen Det Tmt (EPSDT), Medicaid Fee for Service (aka “traditional” Medicaid), Developmentally Disabled Waiver are potential options
- Note: Special Health Services (SHS) is not a Medicaid plan of coverage

Eligibility Status: Yes = active eligibility

Eligibility condition and assignment of claim

- Eligibility Condition

If the individual has third-party medical coverage (health care, accident, automobile), proceeds received/receivable go to the cost of that person's care as well as an eligible spouse and children.

- Assignment of Claim

Medicaid applicants or recipients are deemed to have assigned the right to recovery of medical costs not exceeding the amount of Medicaid funds expended for the care and treatment of the applicant or recipient. Effective on eligibility determination.

Why does this matter?

This is something you need to know for students who may have third-party medical coverage.

We'll get to third party liability (TPL) in just a bit.

Billing/Claims



Consent to Bill Medicaid – hasn't changed yet

The US Department of Education proposed a rule to eliminate the requirement for schools to obtain initial consent before billing Medicaid. Public comment closed August 1st, 2023. [Federal Register :: Assistance to States for the Education of Children With Disabilities](#)

Initial consent is currently a requirement of IDEA prior to IEP service Medicaid billing. 34 Section 300.154(d)(iv).

Written notice would still be required and FERPA consent requirements still apply (see proposed revision to that section to your right).

The revision reads as follows:

§ 300.154 Methods of ensuring services.

★ ★ ★ ★ ★

(d) * * *

(2) * * *

(iv) Prior to accessing a child's or parent's public benefits or insurance for the first time, and annually thereafter, must provide written notification to the child's parents, consistent with § 300.503(c), that includes—

(A) A statement confirming that parental consent to disclose personally identifiable information is required separately under 34 CFR 99.30 and 300.622 and that parents retain all applicable privacy rights under those provisions; and

(B) A statement of the “no cost” provisions in paragraphs (d)(2)(i) through (iii) of this section.

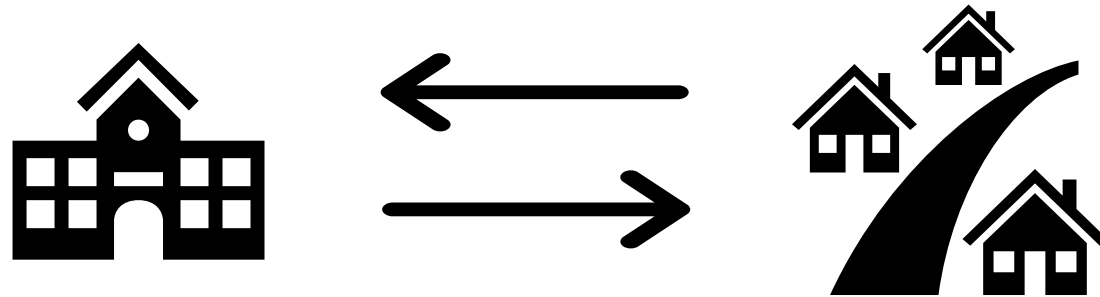

Why isn't there a separate School-based fee schedule?

Because services delivered in schools are the same type of services delivered elsewhere in North Dakota communities.



Each state designs its own Medicaid program within federal regulations and guidelines so other states may do things differently.

Claim Filing Deadlines

- North Dakota Medicaid follows the timely filing requirements found at 42 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 447.45(d). N.D. Admin; Code 75-02-05-04(6).

Timely Filing policy

180 Days - Original Claim Submission

ND Medicaid must receive a provider's original Medicaid primary claim submission within 180 days from the date of service.

365 Days - Final Claim Submissions

Final submission of claims that will be considered for adjudication (including resubmitted claims) must occur within 365 days from the date of service. The complete policy is located [here](#).

Documentation Guidelines



Providers must keep records of services provided for **a minimum of seven years**.

This documentation must be available on request and at no charge (to ND Medical Services/HHS).

Third Party Liability



Third Party Liability (TPL)

Who is a third party?

Anyone (individual, entity, program) who is or may be liable to pay for all or part of a Medicaid-eligible service.

ND Medicaid must do a reasonable search for third-party coverage when members initially apply and when coverage is redetermined. Schools do not need to get this information from families.

Boiling TPL down

Bill for services first.

If there is a legally liable third party identified in MMIS, the claim will reject.

You will see a third-party listed on the Remittance Advice (RA).

Bill the third-party and you will receive an Explanation of Benefits (EOB) letting you know if the third-party covers the service.

You may bill Medicaid for the payment of the balance per the Medicaid allowable fee (from fee schedules).

If there is no coverage for the service, provide ND Medicaid with the EOB showing no coverage.



TPL Food for thought

ND Medicaid doesn't have an interest as to who pays the third party's liability.

State Education Associations (SEAs) can pay TPL through its own funds.

North Dakota Medicaid Policy and Procedures for the Autism Applied Behavior Analysis Service

PURPOSE

To establish a process to assist North Dakota (ND) Medicaid staff in managing Autism Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) service requests and documentation.

RATIONALE

- To aid in consistency and establish guidelines for the Autism ABA service request process.
- To document ND Medicaid criteria for the Autism ABA service.
- To provide consistency in processing the requests for Autism ABA service for children with an autism spectrum disorder.
- To establish ND Medicaid workflow and identify staff responsibilities.
- To respond to Autism ABA service-related requests in a timely manner.
- To provide documentation on ND Medicaid's decision-making process regarding Autism ABA service requests and approval.

FEDERAL CITATIONS

ABA services are regulated by the following:

42 CFR Chapter IV, Subchapter C - Medical Assistance Programs
EPSDT North Dakota Administrative Code 75-02-02.

ABA SERVICE

Medicaid Autism ABA service is the assistance provided to a qualifying individual with an autism spectrum disorder (ASD) diagnosis. The service includes oversight - supporting comprehensive assessment, care plan development, referral, monitoring and follow-up, and skills training for qualifying individuals and their caregivers. Services can occur within the home, community, or a provider's facility.

Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) is a service covered under the Medicaid State Plan for students with an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) diagnosis from their primary care provider or licensed medical care provider qualified to diagnose ASD.

Member eligibility

The following requirements must be met before behavioral health rehabilitative services can be provided through the Medicaid program:

Member must be Medicaid-eligible

Service must be recommended by a practitioner of the healing arts (this means a prescribing professional)

- within the scope of their practice under state law, and applicable regulations

Member must need mental health or behavioral intervention services

- provided by qualified practitioners

Member eligibility, cont'd

Member must have **at least 1 of the following circumstances:**

Be at risk of entering or reentering a mental health facility or hospital and demonstrate a score of 25 or above based on the WHODAS 2.0*; **and/or**

Need substance use disorder treatment services; **and/or**

Have a mental health disorder and be from a household that is in crisis and at risk of major dysfunction that could lead to disruption of the current family makeup; **and/or**

Have a mental health disorder and be in family that has experienced dysfunction that has resulted in disruption of the family.

Provider qualifications

Service must be recommended by a practitioner of the healing arts

This requirement is unique in that it allows for the leverage of a broader workforce to deliver the services.

Medicaid requirements - behavioral health rehabilitative services can be delivered by unlicensed practitioners so long as they are qualified to furnish services and their qualifications include a brief summary of

- Certification,
- Registration,
- Education,
- Training, or
- Experience; and
- Applicable supervisory requirements for unlicensed practitioners.

Provider limitations

OLP Providers

- May only bill for covered services allowed within their scope of practice
- Are not required to enroll as behavioral health rehabilitative service providers

Non-OLP Providers*

- **Must enroll** and submit appropriate attestation based on the provider type
- May only bill Medicaid for services indicated for their practitioner type on the behavioral health rehabilitative services table. (cannot bill under supervising practitioner's NPI)



Skills Restoration	<p>Skills restoration is a time-limited service that assists an individual with restoring needed and desired skills such as daily living/independent living skills to improve the functional impairments affected by the individual's behavioral health diagnoses and symptoms to meet rehabilitation goals. Skills restoration is a systematic series of instructional activities, which include a mixture of education, confirmation, and demonstration of learned skills and capacity for observed learning over time to ensure lasting results that translate to the living environment.</p> <p>Skills restoration interventions used should be based on evidence-based practice.</p> <p>Skills restoration is considered an individual service and if provided in a group setting, must be billed with the appropriate modifiers.</p> <p>Services are limited to four hours per day and must be within each practitioner's scope of practice in accordance with licensure and certification. If additional services are medically necessary, the provider may request service authorization from the North Dakota Medicaid Program.</p>	H2014*
Skills Integration	<p>A service designed to support an individual in the community in their efforts to apply and integrate those life skills that have been learned in their therapy programs. The individual typically requires support for cueing/modeling of appropriate behavioral and life skills to maximize their skills and prevent need for higher levels of care.</p> <p>The service reduces disability and restores an individual to previous functional levels by assisting the individual in ongoing utilization and application of learned skills in normalized living situations. This strengthens the skill development that has occurred and promotes skill integration in various life roles.</p> <p>Services are limited to four hours per day and must be within each practitioner's scope of practice in accordance with licensure and certification. If additional services are medically necessary, the provider may request service authorization from the North Dakota Medicaid Program.</p> <p>Skills integration is considered an individual service and if provided in a group setting, must be billed with the appropriate modifiers.</p>	H2017*

- Complete enrollment paperwork if your school is not currently billing Medicaid or reactivate your enrollment if you haven't billed for a while
 - If you are billing IEP and non-IEP services, ensure you have separate National Provider Identifiers and that you have a separate non-IEP enrollment with ND Medicaid
- Determine if your school will self-bill using the web portal/MMIS or use a billing agent
- If your school will be self-billing ND Medicaid claims, please see the [Billing and Claims portion](#) of our Education and Training website

Billing Checklist


- Verify the student is Medicaid-eligible on the date of service
- Verify that the rendering (provider delivering the service) provider is Medicaid-enrolled (and affiliated, if applicable) on the date of service
- Ensure that the service is covered by ND Medicaid and identify whether it is an IEP or non-IEP service
 - Make sure to bill non-IEP services under the school's non-IEP enrollment so that the Medicaid Match does not apply
- If a claim is denied, double check the first two checkboxes
- If a claim is rejected, check for third-party insurance and bill if appropriate

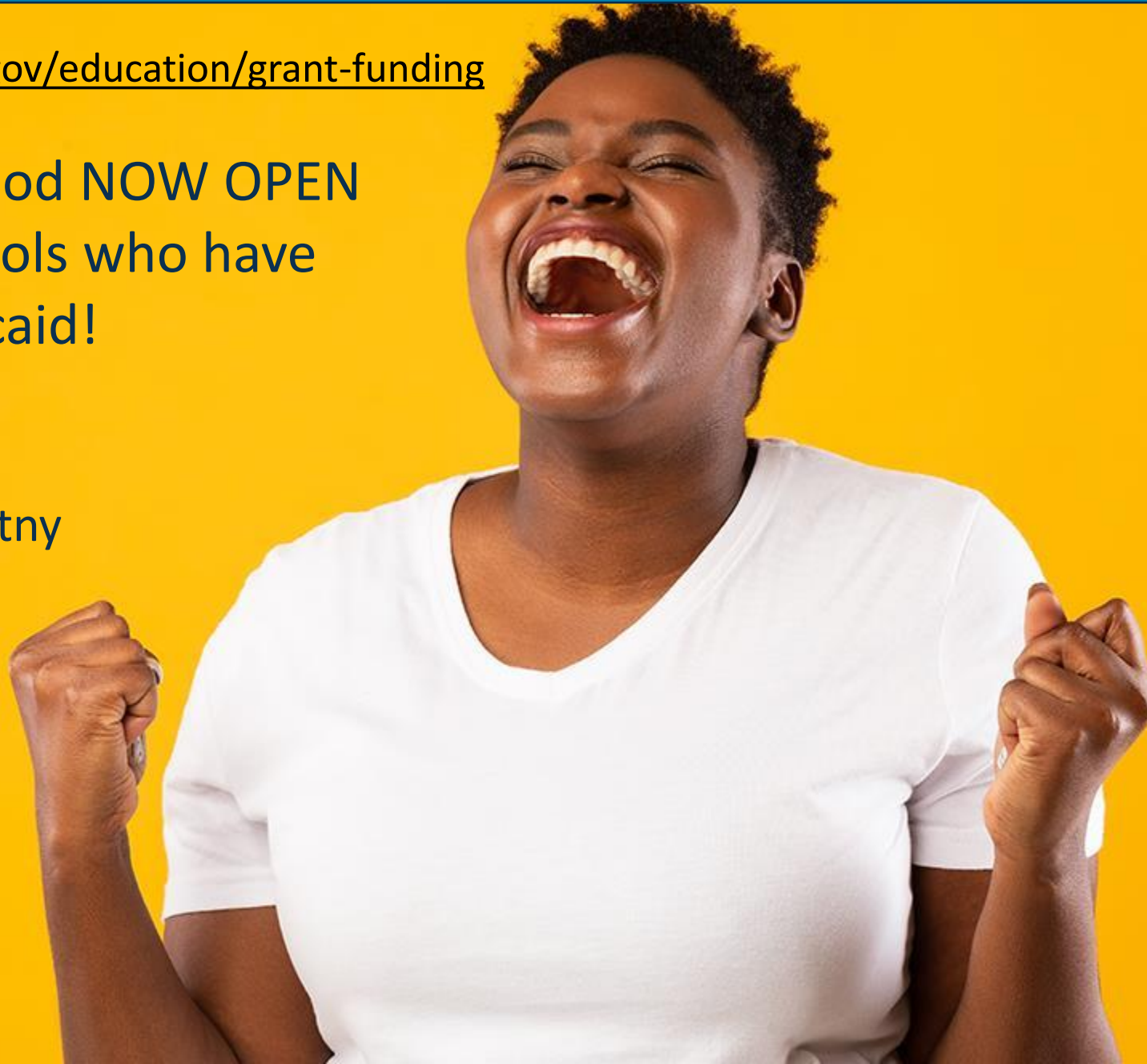

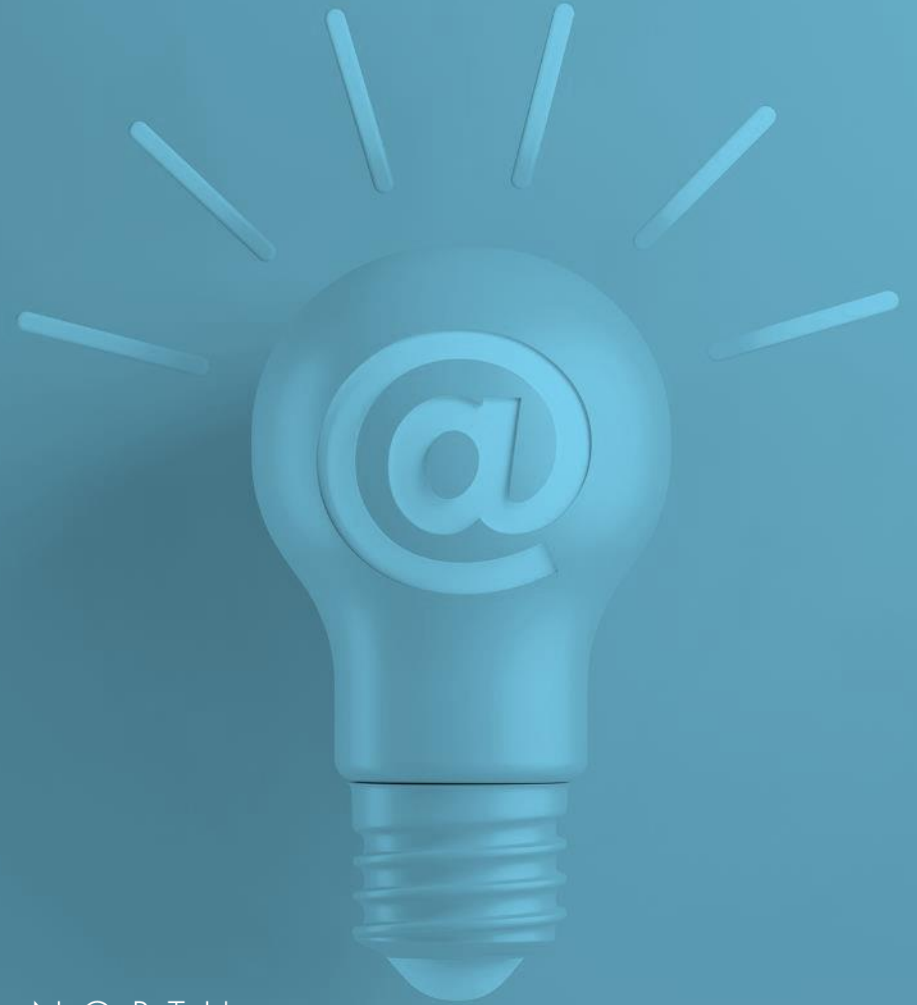
